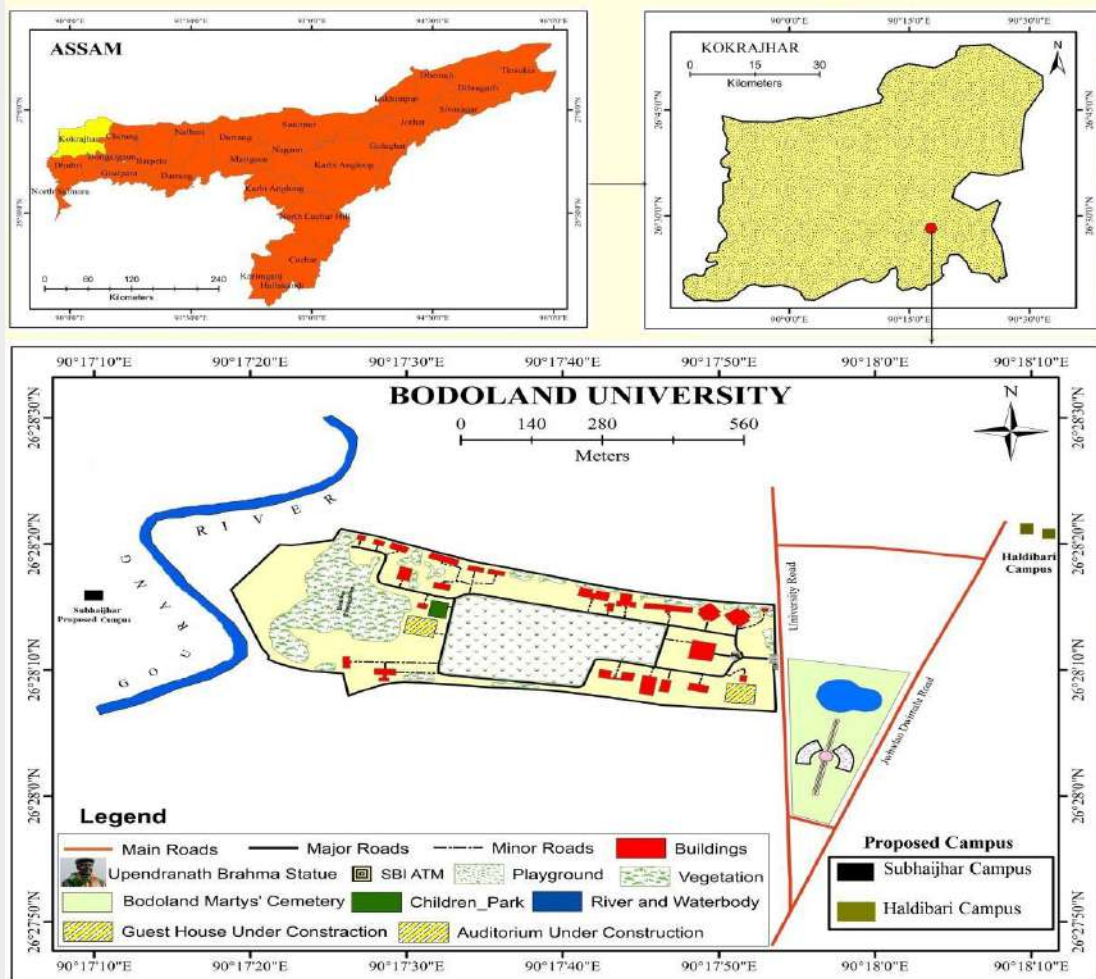

2. For online admission to various courses visit: <https://bunivadm.samarth.edu.in>
3. For applying to more than one course, candidates have to apply separately.
4. All necessary documents to be uploaded must be clearly scanned in PDF format.
5. All the files uploaded must be visible and reproducible.
6. Size of the file/document (maximum 200 KB per document).
7. The dates mentioned above are subject to change depending on the circumstances. Please keep on checking the website of Bodoland University and Assam Samarth.
8. The provisionally admitted students must furnish the Mark Sheets/Grade Cards of the final examination as and when asked. Otherwise, the admission will be cancelled.
9. The Migration Certificate must be furnished whenever the University asks for it.
10. The original documents will be verified at the time of counselling for admission.
11. Anti-ragging
 - a) Applicants have to submit a duly filled Anti-Ragging Form as and when they are asked by the University.

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Bodoland University is a state university established under the Bodoland University Act, 2009, enacted by the Assam Legislative Assembly on 28 February 2009. It has emerged as one of the rapidly developing institutions of higher education in Lower Assam and remains the only university in the western part of the state dedicated to addressing the region's educational and developmental needs. The University is committed to fostering academic growth in Lower Assam, with particular emphasis on the BTC region, and provides access to higher education for the local population. It also serves the educational requirements of neighbouring states and countries, including Bhutan and Nepal.

Bodoland University functions as an affiliating university. It currently comprises 17 postgraduate departments, 62 affiliated degree colleges of BTC including 7 B.Ed. colleges, and one law college. The University offers two-year postgraduate programmes and five-year integrated postgraduate programmes in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Additionally, it offers four-year undergraduate programmes, such as the Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) and the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA), approved by the All-India Council for Technical Education (AICTE). Beyond its core academic offerings, the University provides specialised programmes including a Diploma in Bamboo Technology, a Postgraduate Diploma in Human Rights and Education (PGDHRE), and various short-term diploma and certificate courses. The Padma Shri Madaram Brahma Central Library, a digitally equipped facility, supports academic excellence through comprehensive resources and services. The campus also includes a Health Centre, Technology Incubation Centre, Intellectual Property Rights Cell, transportation services, and hostel facilities for students and research scholars.

The University's picturesque campus is situated at Rangalikhata, Debargaon, approximately 8 kilometres north of Kokrajhar town. Its strategic location facilitates convenient access for students and researchers, including those from neighbouring regions and across international borders. The University is well connected by road through National Highway 31, by rail via Kokrajhar Railway Station, and by air through Rupsi Airport, located about 70 kilometres away. It is also accessible by road from Bhutan's international border (40 km), Bangladesh's (110 km), and West Bengal's state border (45 km). In addition to its main campus, the University operates two auxiliary facilities at Haldibari (3 km away) and Subaijhar (1.5 km away).

III. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

1. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.A./M.Sc./M.Com./IP/Certificate courses

- For Integrated Programme (IP) 45% marks in HS and equivalent courses.
- For PG programmes, B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com. (10+2+3 pattern) with Major/Honours course in the concerned subject with 50% marks.
- Anyone who has attained HS and any other higher degree from recognized institution is eligible for the certificate courses offered by Bodoland University
- Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- The Gap period should not be more than 5 Years.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.C.A. IN COMPUTER SCIENCE & INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- B.Sc. (10+2+3 pattern) with Major/ Honours course in the concerned subject.
- B.C.A/ B.Sc. (IT) (10+2+3 pattern) with Mathematics at the 10+2 level.
- B.Sc. (in the 10+2+3 pattern) with Computer Science/Information Technology as a pass course/ elective subject.
- B.Sc. (10+2+3 pattern) with General Pass course with one-year Computer Diploma (Post-Graduate) from a recognised institute and Mathematics at (10+2) level.
- B.E./ B.Tech. (CSE or IT)

3. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION IN M.Sc. (AI AND ML)

- Bachelor's Degrees :
 - * BCA
 - * B.Sc. in Computer Science

- ### b. Master's Degrees

- a) Science Graduate having Honours in any of the Biological Sciences with 50% marks or equivalent Grade.
- b) Pass course students with a minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade having at least one biological subject in their course combination.
- c) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- d) The Gap period should not be more than 5 Years.

H.S. passed (any stream).

- A Bachelor's Degree of 10+2+3 pattern with a minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade in aggregate or Major/ Honours subject (if any) from any recognised University.
- Relaxation of Marks:** Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- The Gap period should not be more than 5 Years.

- A Bachelor's degree of minimum 3 years duration in any discipline with at least 50% marks in the major /Honours subject or 55% marks in aggregate for those candidates having no major /Honours.
- Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- Candidates must have passed in Mathematics as a subject at 10+2 level or graduation level.

- a) Graduate in any discipline with 45% marks or equivalent grade.
- b) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

9. ELIGIBILITY FOR B.Ed.

- a. Graduate or equivalent from any recognized university with at least 50% mark in aggregate.
- b. In case of an applicant who failed to secure 50% in the UG course, then the candidate must have secured 55% in the PG course.
- c. Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- d. Teachers deputed by the Govt. of Assam for the course must submit a study leave certificate/No Objection Certificate from their concerned employers along with the application.
- e. The Gap period should not be more than 5 Years.

10. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.Ed.

- a) B.Ed./B.T. of Bodoland University or any other university recognised by this university with at least 55% marks in aggregate as per the latest NCTE norms.
- b) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- c) Teachers deputed by the Govt. of Assam for the course must submit a study leave certificate/No Objection Certificate from their concerned employers along with the application.
- d) The Gap period should not be more than 5 Years.

11. CERTIFICATE COURSE IN BODO

- a) Graduate in any discipline with 45% marks or equivalent grade.
- b) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

- a. 80% of the total seats will be reserved for the merit students of affiliated colleges of Bodoland University. The remaining 20% is open for all merit students from UGC-recognised universities, including Bodoland University. (Not applicable for B.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes).
- b. Reservation of seats for the students belonging to different categories will be as per the Government Rules mentioned below.

Note:

- 1) BU Employee's son, daughter, and spouse: 02 (two) seats in each department (in addition to intake capacity).
- 2) Fringe village (within a radius of three kilometer): 05 (five) seats in the University (within intake capacity; maximum two seats per department).
- 3) Ten (10) seats out of the total intake capacity of the institute, one seat in each department, are reserved for foreign students.
- 4) One seat in each department outside the intake capacity is reserved for students from other states of India.
- 5) The candidates seeking admission in the category of **OBC & MOBC** must submit a **non-creamy layer certificate** of the current year.
- 6) ***EWS** 10% reservations will be calculated out of the total unreserved seats.
- 7) 25% seats over and above the total intake capacity are reserved for international students. The reserved seats for international students will not be adjusted by national students under any circumstances.

V. ADMISSION BASED ON SPORTS / EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

For admission under the quota allotted for extracurricular activities such as Cultural, Sports, NCC, Scouts & Guides, candidates must furnish the requisite documents. A few seats (not more than two) may be offered by the concerned Department for admission to M.A./M.Sc. /M.B.A./M.C.A./M.Com. courses to students within the intake capacity who have shown extraordinary proficiency in extracurricular activities in the last three years preceding graduation. Any sport/event organized by an association must be recognised by, and affiliated with, the national body for that sport/event and the Indian Olympic Association.

Preference will be given to candidates in the following order:

- (a) Those who have represented the country in International events
- (b) Those who have represented their states in National/International events
- (c) Those who have represented their institutions in International/National events
- (d) Those who have won prizes at recognized International/National level events
- (e) Those who have won prizes at recognized State level competitions

- (f) Those who have represented the University in N.S.S. Camp at the National level, and
- (g) Those who have obtained NCC 'C' Certificates or participated in the Republic Day Parade at the National level under NCC.

VII. HOW TO APPLY

1. The candidate must carefully go through the online prospectus and be acquainted with all the requirements before filling out the online Application Form.
2. A candidate can apply to different departments separately.
3. Scanned copy (PDF format) of the original certificates/documents should be uploaded.
 - i) Degree mark sheets (as indicated in the online Application Form)
 - (a) For applying to Master /Diploma Courses, candidates must clear all semester examinations or appear in the ensuing 6th/8th Semester Examination in the UG course without any arrear/, betterment/back papers.
 - (b) Candidates who have cleared the 4th/6th Semester Examination in Three/Four-year UG courses (B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.E., B.Tech., etc) must upload all the mark sheets up to the 4th/6th semesters.
 - (c) Candidates who have passed the UG Final Semester Examination, including B.Ed./B.T., need to upload only the Final semester mark sheet.
 - (d) Applicants with more than one mark sheet/grade sheet in a particular semester (repeaters/betterment) must upload all the mark sheets/grade sheets in a single PDF file.
 - ii) Relevant documents (e.g., 10th standard pass certificate/admit card/birth certificate) for age verification.
 - iii) Relevant certificate(s) from the concerned authority when applying for admission under any category of reservation.

- iv) 10th and 12th standard mark sheets and pass certificates.
- v) In the case of B.Ed. and M.Ed. Programme applicants deputed by Govt. of Assam must submit a study leave certificate/No Objection Certificate from their concerned employers.

VIII. SELECTION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- For admission into the Integrated PG Course, there will be no entrance test. However, candidates will be selected based on their HS pass percentage. (Minimum percentage is 45%.)
- For admission into B.Ed., M.Ed., and all PG Courses, the Central Entrance Test will be conducted by the Bodoland University. The entrance test will carry a total of 100 marks (MCQ). The merit list will be prepared on a 100-mark scale, with 60% weightage to the written examination and 40% to the undergraduate-level CGPA. However, for MBA, the written test will be of 80 marks, with 10 marks for the group discussion and 10 marks for the personal interview.
- Selection will be purely based on merit.
- Admission into Ph.D. programme will take place as per the latest UGC Guidelines (Ref.: No. F.4-1(UGC-NET Review Committee)/2024(NET/140648) Dated: 28-03-2024).
- The in-service candidates admitted for Ph.D. will have to submit a No Objection Certificate from the Head of the Institution at the time of application. The Departmental Research Committee (DRC) will decide the number of Ph.D. scholars guided by a supervisor, following Bodoland University Ph.D. regulations.
- If a forged document submitted by a candidate is detected even after admission, the admission will stand cancelled.

- g. The Admission Committee has every right to refuse admission if the candidate fails to produce the original documents when asked for.
- h. The decision of the Admission Committee regarding admission is final.

IX. CANCELLATION OF SEATS

A student failing to attend classes for fifteen days (15 days) at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his/her seat.

X. ATTENDANCE

Attending 75% class is compulsory to appear in all end-of-semester examinations. An undertaking must be submitted at the time of admission to ensure compliance with the required attendance.

XI. SUPREME COURT RULES REGARDING ANTI-RAGGING

- 1) As per the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Government has banned ragging completely in any form inside and outside the campus. Accordingly, Bodoland University authority is determined not to allow any form of ragging inside the university premises. Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or instigates ragging within or outside the University shall have an FIR lodged against him/her, and he/she will be suspended or rusticated from the institution and shall also be liable to be fined, which may extend to Rs. 10,000/-. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission can be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution. The punishment may also include suspension from attending classes, withholding/ withdrawing fellowship/ scholarship and other financial benefits, or withholding the result.
- 2) The candidate, as well as his/her parents, during the admission, will be required to furnish an undertaking in the form of an affidavit that the candidate will not indulge in any form of ragging.
- 3) Submission of Affidavits on Ragging: All admitted students will have to submit two duly-filled Affidavits on Ragging to the concerned Head of Department as and when asked for. Students admitted to hostels will have to submit a second set of the two Affidavits to the Warden of the concerned hostel as and when asked for.

Initiated in 2013-14 as Diploma in Bamboo Technology course under the aegis of the Department of Biotechnology, Bodoland University was sponsored by the Agriculture Department, BTC, now BTR and National Mission on Bamboo Applications, New Delhi. It was upgraded to the “Centre for Bamboo Studies” in 2017 with its independent identity. Bamboo is an important natural, renewable livelihood resource in BTR region. There is a need to enhance it through scientific Cultivation of suitable species and improved management of bamboo-based non-forest or forests. The course is very important for Bodoland Territorial Council because it provides them with in-depth knowledge of various aspects of bamboos.

BAMBOO PROPAGATION CENTRE CUM BAMBUSETUM

Bamboo Propagation Centre cum Bambusetum was established in the University campus in 2015. The propagation centre consists of six propagation beds for conducting practical on local commercial bamboo propagation using various techniques like branch cuttings, culm cuttings, rhizome etc. Occupying an area of about 0.6 hectare, Bambusetum houses different species and varieties of bamboo encountered in Bodoland Territorial Council in addition to some of the rare and ornamental species collected from adjoining areas. The Bambusetum is still on expansion and is planned to have an exhaustive collection of both indigenous and exotic species. The Bambusetum might also serve as a genetic resource for future crop improvement programmes and for forest managers and farmers. At present there are 25 species belonging to 9 genera. *Bambusa* houses 10 species, one forma and two varieties, followed by *Dendrocalamus* having 5 species. The other genera are *Gigantochloa*, *Melocanna*, *Oliveri*, *Oxytenanthera*, *Phyllostachys*, *Pleioblastus*, *Pogonatherum*, and *Thamnocalamus* represented by one species each.

Participated in the "Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh - 2025" from 15th to 22nd November, 2025 featuring a vibrant exhibition showcasing Northeast India's indigenous art and crafts,

handloom traditions, and diverse food cultures. TECHNOLOGY INCUBATION CENTRE (TIC)

The Concept of the Technology Incubation Centre was inaugurated in 2012 at Bodoland University, initially focusing on the cultivation of mushrooms as a demonstration of rural technology. Since then, the center has undertaken various goal-oriented extramural projects funded by agencies such as the Department of Agriculture (BTC), the Department of Tourism (BTC), DICC-Kokrajhar, DBT-GoI Technology Incubation Centre on Mushroom, the DBT-GoI KISAN Hub program, and the DBT-Biotech Hub program for entrepreneurship and skill development of the youth in this region.

With the alarming growth of the global population, the proportional increase in food and nutrition has become a prime concern. This issue is exacerbated by the depletion of fertile agricultural land and other resources. Another issue gaining importance in various discussions is solid waste management, including agricultural waste. Thus, the Technology Incubation Centre of Bodoland University, utilizing rural technology and the concept of a circular economy, has successfully provided employment opportunities to youth and alternative livelihoods to rural farmers by focusing on waste management as the epicenter.

The Centre holds ISO, FSSAI, and Udyam certifications. Covering an area of 10,500 square feet, it provides a platform for students, rural entrepreneurs, women entrepreneurs, and freelancers. The Centre offers summer and winter internship programs for incubates and has trained 10,542 farmers, as well as several entrepreneurs, self-help groups (SHGs), and NGOs.

Advanced Instruments- Scanning Electron Microscope (SEM) & Energy Dispersive X Ray Spectroscopy (EDS), High Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC), Genetic Analyzer (8 Capillary DNA Sequencer), Liquid Chromatography- Quadrupole- Time of Flight High Resolution Mass Spectroscopy (LC-QTOF-HRMS) are installed in the center to support research, training and product development. All this equipment is run on Solar Energy (75 Kilo Watt Hybrid Solar Power Station)

Vision: To develop and enhance rural technologies for skill and entrepreneurship development, thereby augmenting self-aided employment and entrepreneurship ecosystems in the region, and also to provide low-cost yet high-quality health food with enhanced Vitamin D and other essential nutrients by utilizing low-cost agro waste.

Mission: Capacity building and economic upliftment of frontline farmers through an integrated zero waste management approach, involving interventions in cultivation, processing, and value addition of mushrooms. The Centre proposes to offer a Certificate Course in Rural Technology (3 Months-Course Fee Rs. 2500/-) for rural entrepreneurs with informal education, a Diploma in Rural Technology & Bio-entrepreneurship (6 Months-Course Fee Rs. 4500) for rural youths with a minimum qualification of H.S Pass, and a PG-Diploma in Rural Technology, Bio-entrepreneurship & Skill Development (12 Months).

Course Fee (Rs. 5500/-) with a minimum qualification of a degree pass. The Course Content shall include Gobar Gas Preparation, Vermicomposting, Mushroom Cultivation (Basic Mushroom), Medicinal Mushroom, Value-added fortified food product production, Hydroponics, Aquaponics, Arecanut plate making Unit, Biofloc fish cultivation, Pearl

Cultivation, Nursery Management, Beekeeping, Plant Tissue Culture, basic instrumentation, disease diagnostics, basic nutritional estimation, Spawn Production, Advanced Instrumentation (Optional), Business Development Models, etc. The Centre also provides advanced analytical and outsourcing facilities, including Scanning Electron Microscopy (SEM), High-Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC), and Liquid Chromatography–Quadrupole Time-of-Flight High-Resolution Mass Spectrometry (LC-QTOF-HRMS), to support research, innovation, and skill development among students and research scholars.

The PMBCL aims to offer diverse and comprehensive collections, including books, journals, digital resources, and multimedia materials, to cater to the varied needs and interests of patrons. It makes its best effort to assist students, researchers, and teachers in their academic pursuits by providing access to scholarly resources, research assistance, and instructional services tailored to their specific disciplines and projects. It dreams for academic excellence of Bodoland University. Furthermore, it aspires for lifelong learning by promoting a culture of continuous learning and personal growth and by offering educational programs for all age groups, fostering intellectual curiosity and critical thinking skills. The PMBCL stands as one of the strong pillars of the BU to empower users with skills, aptitude and knowledge needed to navigate and evaluate ideas and information effectively in today's digitalized age and thereby helps them at fostering informed decision-making and responsible citizenship. 1. LIBRARY INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

- a. **Reading room:** Presently, four computer terminals have been kept for the users and 100 seating capacity.
- b. **Periodical section:** Several academic journals, periodicals, and magazines are displayed for reading purposes and two magazine shelves are kept for the purpose.
- c. **Reference section:** The Reference collection of the Central Library is presently displayed in 19 book-shelves.
- d. **Internet facilities:** The library provides free internet facilities to users through 15 computers terminals connected with 1gbps leased line for accessing the e-resources. The entire building is Wi-Fi connected, and users are also allowed to access the internet facilities through their laptops.
- e. **Surveillance system:** Most of the passage areas are covered by CCTV to secure the library resources. Security personnel are deployed during the entire functioning hours of the library.

- f. **Library furniture and equipment:** The library has adequate furniture and equipment to facilitate the users.
- g. **DSpace Software:** DSpace software has been installed for institutional repository.
- h. **RFID system:** The PMBCL is an RFID enabled and automated library integrated with open-source ILMs i.e., KOHA to provide computerized services to the users at large.
