#### 1 CAT 2025 Exam Pattern

The CAT 2025 exam is a computer-based test (CBT) with a total duration of 120 minutes, divided into three sections, each with a strict 40-minute time limit (53 minutes and 20 seconds for PwD candidates). The exam is conducted in three slots on the same day: morning (8:30 AM–10:30 AM), afternoon (12:30 PM–2:30 PM), and evening (4:30 PM–6:30 PM). The total number of questions is expected to be 68, with a total of 204 marks.

#### 1.1 Key Features

- Fixed Section Order: Candidates must follow the sequence VARC → DILR → QA, with no option to switch between sections.
- Sectional Time Limit: Each section has a 40-minute limit, and the screen automatically moves to the next section once time expires.
- Onscreen Tools: An onscreen calculator and clock are provided for computations and time management.
- Question Types: Includes Multiple-Choice Questions (MCQs) and Type-In-The-Answer (TITA) questions.

# 2 Section-Wise Breakdown

The CAT 2025 exam comprises three sections, each testing distinct skills. Below is a detailed breakdown of each section, including question distribution and key topics.

## 2.1 Verbal Ability and Reading Comprehension (VARC)

- Number of Questions: 24
- Marks: 72 (3 marks per question)
- Weightage: Approximately 35% of the total exam
- Question Types:
  - Reading Comprehension (RC): 16-18 questions (65-70% of VARC), typically 4 passages with 4-5 questions each
  - Verbal Ability: 6–8 questions, including Para Jumbles, Odd Sentence, Paragraph Summary, and Sentence Correction
- TITA Questions: 4–6 (no negative marking)

### 2.2 Data Interpretation and Logical Reasoning (DILR)

- Number of Questions: 22
- Marks: 66 (3 marks per question)
- Weightage: Approximately 32% of the total exam
- Question Types:
  - Data Interpretation (DI): 8–10 questions, often in sets of 4–5, based on tables, graphs, pie charts, and caselets
  - Logical Reasoning (LR): 12–14 questions, focusing on puzzles, seating arrangements, blood relations, and Venn diagrams
- TITA Questions: 4–6 (no negative marking)

## 2.3 Quantitative Ability (QA)

- Number of Questions: 22
- Marks: 66 (3 marks per question)
- Weightage: Approximately 32% of the total exam
- Question Types: Predominantly MCQs with 4–6 TITA questions
- TITA Questions: 4–6 (no negative marking)

# 3 Marking Scheme

The CAT 2025 marking scheme is consistent across all sections:

- Correct Answer (MCQ and TITA): +3 marks
- Incorrect Answer (MCQ): -1 mark
- Incorrect Answer (TITA): No negative marking
- Unattempted Questions: 0 marks
- Negative marking applies only to MCQs, making TITA questions less risky.
