Housing, Health, and Education

Thus:

Step 2: Match Radical School.

Radical School studies:

Social Inequality and Capitalism

Thus:

$(B) \rightarrow (1)$

Step 3: Match Behavioural School.

Behavioural School focuses on:

Lived Experience and Perception

Thus:

$(C) \rightarrow (2)$

Step 4: Match Determinism.

Determinism states:

Nature Controls Human Action

Thus:

$(D) \rightarrow (4)$

Step 5: Identify the correct option.

Therefore, the correct matching is:

Solution:

Step 1: Match Ruhr Region.

Ruhr region of Germany is famous for:

Coal and Iron Ore Base

Thus:

(A) → (2)

Step 2: Match High-Tech Industry.

High-tech industries are associated with:

Silicon Valley

Thus:

(B) → (1)

Step 3: Match Footloose Industry.

Footloose industries:

Do not depend heavily on specific raw materials

Thus:

$(C) \rightarrow (3)$

Step 4: Match Cottage Industry.

Cottage industries require:

Minimum Capital and Local Raw Material

Thus:

$(D) \rightarrow (4)$

Step 5: Identify the correct option.

Therefore, the correct matching is:

$A - 2, B - 1, C - 3, D - 4$

3. Which of the following is a Quaternary activity?

Correct Answer: (C) Software Development/Information Research

Solution:

Concept: Quaternary activities are knowledge-oriented services involving:

- Research
- Information technology
- Data processing
- Software services

These activities are based on intellectual skills and information handling.

Step 1: Identify the quaternary activity.

Software Development/Information Research

is based on specialised knowledge and information services. Thus:

Software Development/Information Research

Step 2: Analyze the remaining options.

Teaching in a school This is a tertiary service activity.

⇒ Incorrect

Working in a call center This is also a tertiary service activity.

⇒ Incorrect

Operating a CNC machine This belongs to manufacturing/secondary activity.

⇒ Incorrect

Step 3: Identify the correct option.

Therefore, the correct answer is:

Software Development/Information Research

Hence, the correct answer is:

(C)

4. Arrange the following modes of transport in terms of their historical emergence (Earliest to Latest):

1. Railways
2. Pipelines
3. Air Transport
4. Steam Ships

- (A) 4, 1, 3, 2
(B) 1, 4, 3, 2
(C) 4, 1, 2, 3
(D) 1, 3, 4, 2

Correct Answer: (A) 4, 1, 3, 2

Solution:

Concept: Different transport systems developed at different times in history. Their order of development from earliest to latest is:

- Steam Ships
- Railways
- Air Transport
- Pipelines

Step 1: Identify the earliest transport mode.

Steam ships were developed during the Industrial Revolution before railways became

widespread. Thus:

4

comes first.

Step 2: Identify the next development.

Railways emerged after steamship development. Thus:

1

comes second.

Step 3: Identify the modern transport systems.

Air transport developed in the early twentieth century. Thus:

3

comes next. Pipelines became widely used later for transporting petroleum and gas. Thus:

2

comes last.

Step 4: Determine the correct sequence.

Therefore, the correct chronological order is:

4, 1, 3, 2

Hence, the correct answer is:

(A)

Quick Tip: Historical order of transport:

Steam Ships → Railways → Air Transport → Pipelines

5. Statement I: Outsourcing helps in reducing costs and increasing efficiency.

Statement II: KPO (Knowledge Process Outsourcing) involves more high-end tasks than BPO.

- (A) Both are correct.
- (B) Both are incorrect.
- (C) Only I is correct.
- (D) Only II is correct.

Correct Answer: (A) Both are correct.

Solution:

Concept: Outsourcing refers to obtaining services or business operations from external sources to improve efficiency and reduce operational costs.

KPO and BPO are important forms of outsourcing.

Step 1: Analyze Statement I.

Outsourcing:

- Reduces operational costs
- Improves productivity
- Increases efficiency

Thus:

Statement I is Correct

Step 2: Analyze Statement II.

KPO:

Knowledge Process Outsourcing

involves specialised and knowledge-based work such as:

- Research
- Data analysis
- Financial consultancy

These are more advanced than routine BPO services. Thus:

Statement II is Correct

Step 3: Identify the correct option.

Since both statements are correct:

Both are correct

Hence, the correct answer is:

(A)

Quick Tip:

BPO → Routine Services

KPO → Knowledge Based High End Services

6. Which of the following pairs is INCORRECT?

Solution:

Concept: Major trans-continental railways connect important cities and regions across countries.

Step 1: Analyze Trans-Siberian Railway.

The Trans-Siberian Railway connects:

St. Petersburg to Vladivostok

⇒ Correct

Step 2: Analyze Canadian Pacific Railway.

The Canadian Pacific Railway connects:

Halifax to Vancouver

⇒ Correct

Step 3: Analyze Union and Pacific Railway.

The Union and Pacific Railway connects:

New York to San Francisco

⇒ Correct

Step 4: Analyze Australian Trans-Continental Railway.

The Australian Trans-Continental Railway mainly connects:

Perth to Sydney

is not the standard description. The railway is generally associated with:

Perth to Adelaide

Thus, the given pair is incorrect.

Step 5: Identify the incorrect pair.

Therefore, the incorrect pair is:

Australian Trans-Continental Railway : Perth to Sydney

Hence, the correct answer is:

(D)

Quick Tip:

Trans-Siberian Railway

is the longest railway route in the world.

Atlantic Ocean to Pacific Ocean

Thus:

(B) → (1)

Step 3: Match Rhine Waterway.

The Rhine Waterway connects:

Switzerland to North Sea

Thus:

(C) → (3)

Step 4: Match Volga Waterway.

The Volga Waterway is connected with the:

Caspian Sea

Thus:

(D) → (4)

Step 5: Identify the correct option.

Therefore, the correct matching is:

Solution:

Concept: Ports are called:

Gateways of International Trade

because they handle the movement of goods and passengers between countries through sea

routes.

Step 1: Understand the role of ports.

Ports:

- Connect countries through maritime transport
- Facilitate import and export trade
- Handle international cargo

Thus:

Ports

are known as gateways of international trade.

Step 2: Analyze the remaining options.

Airports Mainly associated with air transport.

⇒ Incorrect

Highways Used for land transport within regions and countries.

⇒ Incorrect

Inland Waterways Used mainly for internal water transport.

⇒ Incorrect

Step 3: Identify the correct option.

Therefore, the correct answer is:

Ports

Hence, the correct answer is:

(B)

Quick Tip: Ports are called:

Gateways of International Trade

because they connect nations through sea trade.

9. Consider these statements regarding WTO:

Solution:

Concept: The World Trade Organization (WTO) is an international organization that regulates global trade between nations.

It was established in:

1995

replacing the:

GATT

(General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade).

Step 1: Analyze Statement 1.

WTO replaced GATT in:

1995

Thus:

Statement 1 is Correct

Step 2: Analyze Statement 2.

WTO is the principal global organization dealing with international trade rules.

Thus:

Statement 2 is Correct

Step 3: Analyze Statement 3.

The headquarters of WTO are located in:

Geneva, Switzerland

not New York.

Thus:

Statement 3 is Incorrect

Step 4: Identify the correct option.

Therefore, the correct statements are:

1 and 2

Hence, the correct answer is:

(A)

10. Identify the 'Entrepot Port' among the following:

- (A) Singapore
- (B) London
- (C) Rotterdam
- (D) All of the above

Correct Answer: (D) All of the above

Solution:

Concept: An entrepot port is a port where imported goods are stored and re-exported to other countries.

Such ports function as important international trade and distribution centers.

Step 1: Analyze Singapore.

Singapore is a major international re-export trade center.

⇒ Entrepot Port

Step 2: Analyze London.

London has historically functioned as an important entrepot trading port.

⇒ Entrepot Port

Step 3: Analyze Rotterdam.

Rotterdam is one of the world's major re-export and transit ports.

⇒ Entrepot Port

Step 4: Identify the correct option.

Since all the listed ports are entrepot ports:

All of the above

Hence, the correct answer is:

(D)

Quick Tip: An entrepot port:

Imports, Stores, and Re-exports Goods

to other countries.
