Reading Comprehension

Passage

The environmental challenges faced by the world today are unprecedented in their scope and complexity. From climate change and deforestation to water scarcity and biodiversity loss, the planet's ecosystems are under tremendous pressure. Addressing these issues requires a multifaceted approach, involving not only technological innovation and policy reform but also changes in individual behavior and societal values. As the world grapples with these challenges, it is crucial to foster a sense of shared responsibility and collective action.

Question 1: According to the passage, what are the main environmental challenges mentioned?

- A. Climate change and water scarcity
- B. Deforestation and loss of biodiversity
- C. Both A and B
- D. Technological innovation and policy reform

Answer: C. Both A and B

Solution:

The passage explicitly lists "climate change," "deforestation," "water scarcity," and "biodiversity loss" as key environmental challenges. Option A and B each mention parts of these challenges, so the correct answer is C, which includes both.

Solution:

The word "unprecedented" means "never done or known before." The phrase "scope and complexity" refers to size and difficulty. Therefore, the phrase means the challenges are larger and more difficult than anything seen before, making option B the correct choice.

Question 4: What does the author imply about the role of individuals in addressing environmental challenges?

Answer: B. Individual behavior change is crucial.

Solution:

The passage mentions that addressing environmental challenges requires "changes in individual behavior," highlighting the importance of personal responsibility alongside policy and technology. Therefore, option B is correct.

Solution:

The word "despite" suggests the proposal had negative aspects, but the board proceeded anyway. "Drawbacks" and "weaknesses" both indicate negative qualities or disadvantages, fitting the context. The other Option mostly describe positive traits, which would not fit after "despite."

Look for contrast words like "despite" to identify which Option show negative qualities.

Solution:

"Fascinating" and "compelling" both convey strong interest and attraction, making them the correct choices. The other Option imply boredom or dullness, which contradict the description.

"Lukewarm" means mildly or weakly positive, which fits perfectly. The other Option are either too extreme (e.g., "scathing") or overly positive (e.g., "glowing").

Solution:

The other Option are either too negative (e.g., "abrasive") or too positive (e.g., "genial," "approachable," "warm") to make the sentence logically consistent.
