Options (B), (C), and (D) contradict the passage's content since the passage states renewable energy reduces emissions, does not suggest increased fossil fuel use, and implies technological progress.

Therefore, option (C) correctly identifies a challenge discussed in the passage.

Option (A) is incorrect because the passage does not state that neuroplasticity prevents brain injuries, only that it helps in recovery. Options (C) and (D) are incorrect because the passage indicates that neuroplasticity supports learning and memory, rather than hindering or limiting them.

Therefore, option (B) correctly identifies a benefit of neuroplasticity described in the passage.

Therefore, option (B) accurately captures the challenge discussed in the passage: the need for energy storage solutions to ensure a reliable and stable renewable energy supply.

Therefore, the best answer is (C), which directly reflects the ethical concerns discussed: the effects of AI on privacy and decision-making.

Thus, the best answer is (C), which directly corresponds to the loss of habitat for polar species caused by melting ice caps.
