Sir Doctor Harisingh Gour (26 November 1870 – 25 December 1949) was a distinguished lawyer, jurist, educationist, social reformer, poet, and novelist. Dr. Harisingh Gour was the First Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi and Nagpur University, founder Vice-Chancellor of the University of Sagar, Deputy President of the Central Legislative Assembly of British India, an Indian Delegate to the Joint Parliamentary Committee, a Member of the Indian Central Committee associated with the Royal Commission on the Indian Constitution (popularly known as the Simon Commission) and a Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature.

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From the Desk of Vice-Chancellor



I am delighted to present our University to you and welcome you to be involved in the progress of the university as its stakeholders. I also take this opportunity to invite all those who aspire for true learning and quality education to Doctor Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar, a seat of learning established as a University in Madhya Pradesh in 1946 with a campus spread over about 1300 acres. It was upgraded to a Central University on 15th January 2009 and was accredited 'A+' Grade (3.38 score) by NAAC in the Fourth cycle.

The University offers multidisciplinary academic programs at undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral levels through its 11 Schools with sound infrastructure and innovative approach for teaching. The University has well equipped laboratories with modern and sophisticated instruments to encourage quality research. Most of the Departments have project funds from UGC, DST, ICMR, MPCST and other national agencies. Some are also recognized centers of the UGC and DST under the DRS, PURSE and FIST programmes. Under GIAN scheme, eminent academicians are invited from abroad to acquaint the students with the latest developments in their respective fields. The implementation of CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) enables the students to have access to the latest pattern of teaching and learning. The Department of Physical Education and the Department of Fine Arts & Performing Arts provide hands-on sports training activities and cultural activities respectively to the students. For an all-round development of students, sports and cultural activities are assigned to a specific time schedule in the academic calendar. Students regularly represent the University at national level competitions and win laurels.

Besides the departmental libraries, the University has a Central Library with approximately four lakh books, e-books and e-journals. Under the INFLIBNET and DELNET programmes, the students and faculty can access valuable sources of literature. The University campus is Wi-Fi enabled.

There are separate hostels within the campus for boys and girls pursuing various programmes upto doctoral level to provide a safe and congenial Gurukul-like environment of learning. In addition, facilities like stadium, gymnasiums, sports complex, playgrounds and open-air theatre are also available to cater to the extra-curricular requirements of the students.

The University has an adequate number of competent, dedicated and trained faculty members to enhance the knowledge of the students. The courses are well designed and suited to the present day demands. The faculty is involved in developing innovative methods of teaching and learning with the help of an in-campus Educational Multi-Media Research Centre (EMMRC). Under the aegis of the UGC, New Delhi, the Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Center (Formally UGC-Human Resource Development Centre) conducts orientation and refresher programs for the faculty. Day care centre is available in the university campus.

To create high-quality academic ambience and to motivate and enthuse our students towards perfection in their academic endeavors, we offer meticulously designed and diverse curricula as well as optional courses at graduate, postgraduate and doctorate levels. Besides, the University has an Institute of Distance Education (IDE) enabling our students to pursue PG Diploma courses with regular PG/Ph.D. programmes to enhance their employability. B.Tech. programmes are also being offered under Institute of Engineering and Technology.

The University is proud of the numerous academicians, administrators, judges, philosophers, writers, poets, critics and artists who have brought laurels to their Alma Mater in the last seven decades.

We are committed to promote academic excellence and socially relevant education in consonance with the goal to achieve contemporary standards of learning. We look for brilliant and hardworking students for fulfilling our objectives of attaining heights of excellence in the field of knowledge.

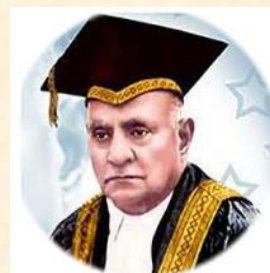

University at a Glance

The founder and mentor Sir Doctor Harisingh Gour desired to establish an educational institution to provide the opportunity of higher learning for a rural and deprived population of Central India. He was inspired by Cambridge and Oxford Universities as the models. The University of Saugar, later renamed as Doctor Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya in February 1983, was established on July 18, 1946 by him out of his lifelong earnings. The University was the sixteenth university in the country and the first in the State of Madhya Pradesh at that time. The University was upgraded as Central University on January 15, 2009, by the Central Universities Act, 2009. The President of India is the Visitor of the University.



The University campus is spread over an area of about 1300 acres, surrounded by lush green forests, and is situated in the natural and eco-friendly environment. The University provides a congenial academic atmosphere to the learners to nurture their potential for excellence. There are **38** independent teaching departments in the University, some of them are recognized centers of the UGC and DST under the DRS, PURSE and FIST programmes. There are four hostels for boys and four for girls. Residential facilities are available for teachers and officials of the University. Our first Prime Minister Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru laid the 'foundation stone' of the University Library in 1952 which is named after him.

The University has adopted 'School of Study' system for promoting intra and inter school academic programmes. Eleven schools were established under the new system which offers courses ranging from Physical Sciences to Applied Sciences and Technology, Law, Business Management, Applied Geology, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Humanities, Arts & Information Science, Social Sciences and Music & Performing Arts.

The University has well qualified and experienced faculties (www.dhsgsu.irins.org) who are continuously engaged in providing quality teaching and research to the knowledge-seeking young scholars. Some of the faculties have the experience of working in Internationally renowned educational institutes.

The Banking, Postal, Health & Sanitation and Cafeteria services are available at the University premises. There is an auditorium for indoor games and a playground for outdoor games as well as a well-equipped and furnished Golden Jubilee Hall with a seating capacity of 750 to facilitate the cultural and academic activities.

The University has various centers for developmental activities such as UGC- Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Center (Formally UGC-Human Resource Development Centre), Center for Advance Research (CAR), Institute of Distance Education, Study centre of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), Educational Multi-Media Research Centre (EMMRC), Teaching and Learning Centre (TLC), Remedial Coaching centre, Community College, Population Research Centre (PRC) of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and Manuscript logy Research Centre of the Ministry of Culture, Government of India.

Academic Departments, Hostels and Libraries are well equipped with Wi-Fi through National Knowledge Network (NKN) and e-resources are accessible through Wi-Fi. The Integrated University Management Systems (IUMS) and Learning Management Systems (LMS) are available for providing all the possible online facilities.

About National Testing Agency (NTA)

The Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India (GoI) has established the National Testing Agency (NTA) as an independent, autonomous, and self-sustained premier testing organization under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 for conducting efficient, transparent and international standards tests in order to assess the competency of candidates for admissions to premier higher education institutions. The National Testing Agency (NTA) has assigned the task of conducting the Common University Entrance Test (CUET-PG) for all postgraduate programmes and selected undergraduate programmes (B.Lib.I.Sc. and LL.B.) for academic session 2026-27 for the Central Universities.

The role, function and duties of NTA is confined to registration of desirous applicants for the exam, admitting them to the exam, conducting the exam all India level in the prescribed mode, display of answer keys and inviting challenges, finalizing the answer keys, processing the results and handing over the results to Dr. Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar (M.P.).

Admission to Postgraduate (PG) and Selected Undergraduate (UG) Programmes (2026-27)

Admissions in various PG programmes and few selected UG programmes (only B.Lib.I.Sc. and LL.B.) will be given to the applicants according to the merit in **Common University Entrance Test (CUET-PG) 2026**, conducted by National Testing Agency, followed by verification of eligibility in the respective academic programmes and counselling thereafter to be conducted by the Vishwavidyalaya. The weightage of NCC, NSS and others (if any allowed) shall be added in the preparation of final merit of applicants to provide admission.

Candidates having supplementary/ ATKT/ backlog in any annual/ semester of qualifying examination and their result is awaited at the time of counselling shall not be granted admission (unless cleared). Provisional admission shall be given only to those applicants who have appeared in the regular final-year/ final-semester of the qualifying examination and their result is awaited, and all previous years/ semesters examinations are cleared.

The admission of such students shall be purely provisional and they will have to submit their result latest by **31 October, 2026 (tentative)**, failing which their provisional admission will automatically stand cancelled and fee paid by them shall stand forfeited. No representation in this regard shall be entertained at any level. To strengthen the spirit of quality in higher education, the Vishwavidyalaya reserves the right to decide the minimum cut-off marks to qualify based on NTA scores (if so desired).

- (i) For M.A., M.Sc., M.Com., M.B.A., M.Pharm., M.Tech. (Applied Geology), M.S.W., M.C.A., M.P.A. (Performing Arts), M.F.A. (Fine Arts) and P.G.- Diploma in Labour Studies/ Geoinformatics the maximum age limit will be **27 years** for unreserved category (UR), EWS and OBC-NCL candidates and **32 years** for candidates belonging to SC, ST and PwD categories on **31st July 2026**.
- (ii) For M.A.-J.M.C., M.Lib.I.Sc., M.Ed., LL.M., M.A. in Rural Development and M.A./ M.Sc. in Yogic Science, the maximum age limit will be **35 years** for Unreserved category (UR), EWS and OBC-NCL candidates and **40 years** for candidates belonging to SC, ST and PwD categories on **31st July 2026**.
- (iii) For LL.B.: There is no age restriction for this programme. The age limit is subject to the decision of the Supreme Court or the directions of the Bar Council of India in this regard.

Note:

- University has the right to vary the seats in any of the above programmes.
- Candidates must check the eligibility criteria (subject) in the qualifying examination before filling the form in respective programme.

2.0 General Rules for Admission:

(i) Candidates appearing/ appeared in their final year/ semester of the **qualifying examination** have to apply and appear in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET-PG) for PG and selected UG programmes (B.Lib.I.Sc. and LL.B.) to be conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA). **However, the candidates are required to produce original marksheets of the qualifying examination at the time of the counselling to get admission.** But if they have appeared in the qualifying examination and their result is not declared till the date of counselling, provisional admission in the programme may be allowed, provided:

- (a) Candidate must produce a certificate from the competent authority (such as Controller of Examinations, Registrar, etc.) to the effect that the candidate has appeared in the qualifying examination and the result has not been declared yet.
- (b) Provisional admission shall be given only to those students whose regular final year/ semester examination results are awaited and previous all year/ semester exams are clear. Such students will have to submit their result tentatively by **31st October, 2026**, failing which their admission will stand cancelled automatically and fee paid by him/ her shall stand forfeited. No representation in this regard shall be entertained at any level. The candidate, in this case, shall have to produce the marksheet of the previous examination of that course in which his/her final result is awaited.

Note: A candidate having supplementary/ backlog/ ATKT in any year/ semester of qualifying examination at the time of counselling shall not be consider eligible for admission.

(ii) "Aggregate percentage of marks" will not include grace marks awarded to a candidate. Similarly, marks of the additional subject (if any) for improvement of aggregate percentage/ division will not be consider for admission.

Note: The percentage of marks in aggregate shall be computed on the basis of total marks secured in all the subjects studied in the programme. In case of any ambiguity/ interpretational difficulties, the decision of the University shall be final.

- (iii) (a) Degrees/Certificates recognized by Association of Indian Universities (AIU) shall only be deemed as equivalent degrees/certificates.
- (b) The Distance Education Council of India, University Grants Commission are the authority to recognize the Degrees/ Certificates of Distance Education. Such Candidates will be required to submit certificates from the Distance Education Council of India/ IGNOU, New Delhi regarding recognition/approval of the courses. No other distance education degree will be entertained.

- (iv) Mere appearance in the CUET-PG (NTA), does not entitle a candidate to be considered for admission to the programme unless he/ she fulfills the other eligibility conditions. If an applicant, who does not fulfill the minimum eligibility requirements and is inadvertently allowed to appear in CUET-PG (NTA), he/she shall not be **entitled to use such case as a right to stake the claim** for admission later saying that he/she meets the eligibility requirements.
- (v) The candidates, who submit the forged/ fake certificates or adopts fraudulent means, shall be debarred from admission and the matter will be reported to the Police.
- (vi) The University reserves the right to cancel/ refuse admission at any point of time if it is found that:
 - (a) Minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled.
 - (b) False documentation has been done or facts have been suppressed.
 - (c) Misconduct and indecent communication done by candidate.
 - (d) Irregularities are in admission of candidate.
 - (e) Any other valid reason.
- (vii) The University reserves the right to increase/decrease the number of seats.
- (viii) The eligibility requirement for the purpose of admission mentioned in this Admission Brochure shall be final.
- (ix) If any rules or regulations mentioned in the brochure stand contradictory or/and found to be mistaken, then in this case, the rules or regulations mentioned in the university ordinance will be considered final. Moreover, the decision of Vice-Chancellor shall be final.
- (x) The candidate should see the fee structure given in the Admission Brochure before filling the application form. No representation regarding reduction of fee shall be entertained after admission and until completion of the programme.
- (xi) **Portal registration fee:** The candidate has to pay online portal registration fee separately for registering himself/herself on the online Samarth Portal whose exact amount shall be decided by the Vishwavidyalaya. This fee (currently Rs. 500 for registration in one programme only and Rs. 100 per additional registration, for session 2026-27) will be same for all categories and will be non-refundable.
- (xii) The category certificate is mandatory to produce at the time of counselling for SC/ ST/ OBC-NCL/ EWS/ PwD applicants.
- (xiii) For equal CUET-PG score of two applicants, following shall be the criteria of deciding their mutual ranks:
 - (a) Higher in cumulative percentage of all earlier available semesters as evident in available marksheet,
 - (b) If (a) equals then higher in marks in 12th standard marksheet,
 - (c) If (a), (b) equals then higher in age.

3.0 Reservation of Seats:

- (i) As per Government of India rules, the benefit of reservation shall be given only to those sections, which are listed in the central list published by the Government of India.
- (ii) Candidates belonging to OBC-NCL, SC, ST, General-Economically Weaker Section (General-EWS) and Person with Benchmark Disability (PwBD) categories will be given reservation as per the Government of India rules i.e. OBC(NCL)-27%, SC-15%, ST-7.5%, Economically Weaker Section (EWS)-10%. For Person with Disability (PwD) candidates, 5% seats shall be reserved on horizontal basis, subject to the condition that the candidate fulfills the other minimum eligibility requirements. Submission of a certificate to this effect issued by a competent authority/Board (see section 3.1) shall be mandatory at the time of counselling.

For the purpose of reservation under Economically Weaker Section (EWS) category, a person must comply with Government of India rules.

- (iii) **Consideration of reserved category meritorious candidates as unreserved candidates.** In a course, if the merit of a reserved category candidate is more than or equal to the merit of the last admitted general candidate in that course, the reserved category candidate will be treated as unreserved. Provided further that, if a meritorious reserved category candidate is admitted by relaxing the general qualifying standards (minimum eligibility requirement and /or age) which he/she would not have got by remaining under the unreserved then his/her admission shall be adjusted against the concerned reserved category quota and the consequential vacancy created in the unreserved category shall be filled up by a General category candidate in order of merit.

3.1 Certificates Required for Reserved Categories

3.1.1 Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes: Each SC/ ST candidate has to submit a self- attested copy of the Certificate issued by the Competent Authority mentioning that the candidate belongs to SC/ST category. The following are empowered to issue the certificate:

- (i) District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Collector/ Deputy Commissioner / Addl. Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector / 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner, or
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate, or
- (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar, or
- (iv) Sub- Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family resides, or
- (v) Administrator/Secretary to the Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands). Candidates must note that certificate from any other person/authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the candidate claims to belong to SC or ST category, his/her caste/tribe must be listed in the appropriate Government of India schedule. The Caste Certificate should clearly state: (a) Name of his/her caste/tribe (b) whether he/she belongs to SC or ST (c) District and the State or Union Territory of his/her usual place of residence and (d) the appropriate Govt. of India schedule under which his/her caste/ tribe is approved by it as SC or ST.

- (vi) **As per the UGC letter No. F1-27/2009(SCT) dated 09-09-2015 and MHRD letter No.F.No.14-5/2013-SC/ST dated 13-01-2014:** Clause No.3 (i) No fees need to be charged at the time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for the Post-Matric Scholarships/Top Class Scholarships. At the time of admission, they may be advised to deposit the fee to the Institute as soon as they receive the Scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission.

Note: No concession in fees shall be given in self-financed programmes. Applicant must ensure about this before admission.

3.1.2 Other Backward Classes (OBC - NCL): The candidates belonging to OBC-NCL category as listed by the Central Government must submit a self-attested copy of certificate issued by the competent authority. The OBC-NCL certificate should clearly mention that the candidate belongs to **Non-Creamy Layer (NCL)**. The OBC-NCL candidate will be required to produce original income certificate having validity on the date of counselling. If no validity date is mentioned in the certificate, then it should have been issued in the financial year **2026-27**.

3.1.3 Person with Benchmark Disability (PwBD): Visually Impaired and/ or Hearing Impaired and/or Orthopedically Handicapped (on horizontal reservation basis) candidates, have to submit a self- attested copy of Disability Certificate issued by the District Chief Medical Officer/Medical Board. The disability benefits will be given to those candidates only who have at least 40% physical impairments. The percentage of disability should be mentioned in the certificate.

3.1.4 General-Economically Weaker Section (General-EWS): The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate (should be of current financial year **2026-27**) issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as belonging to EWS:

- (i) District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate
- (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and
- (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer or the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

3.2. Special Provisions for Admission:

3.2.1 Players (Sports Persons): **One (01)** supernumerary seat for each Postgraduate Programme and **two (02)** supernumerary seats for each selected Undergraduate Programmes (B.Lib.I.Sc. and LL.B.) for players (Sports Quota) shall be available.

The following conditions should be fulfilled for the eligibility for seats under sports quota:

- (i) The candidates should fulfill the minimum eligibility criteria for admission to the programme.
- (ii) The candidate should have appeared in the CUET-PG (NTA) of the concerned programme and cleared the cut off marks, if any.
- (iii) The candidate must fulfill the participation rules/ norms of Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- (iv) The candidate should have played National (senior/ junior/ sub-junior/ youth school/ Games Federation of India) at least up to qualifying examination or should have secured a position in Zonal/Inter-Zonal/ Direct All India up to 4th position Inter-University Tournament of AIU games or have participated at these levels.

The merit of the qualified candidates for the admission under Sports Quota shall be decided by the Games/ Sports Committee on the sport achievement marks awarded on the basis of certificates of achievements. Highest Sport achievement marks/ performance of a candidate will only be considered while counting the sports achievement marks.

In case of equal sports achievement points of candidates, ranking will be decided on the basis of the marks obtained in the Entrance Test. Moreover, if the marks obtained by candidates in the Entrance Test is also equal; then the aggregate percentage of marks in the qualifying examination will be considered. If these are also equal, then the candidate senior in age will be preferred.

Note: The candidates seeking admission to sports quota must submit the hard copy of the online submitted application form along with self-attested copies of relevant certificates as on date notified by the University on the address: **Admission Cell, Doctor Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar - 470003, Madhya Pradesh, India** by Hand/ Speed Post. [on or before the dates notified by the University (Admission Cell)].

3.2.2 N. C. C. Cadets:

The following benefits will be given on the basis of N.C.C. certificates produced by the candidates:

- Five percent (5%) of the total marks of the Entrance Test (CUET-PG) will be added to the marks obtained in the Entrance Test for those candidates who have "C" certificate.
- Four percent (4%) of the total marks of the Entrance Test (CUET-PG) will be added to the marks obtained in the Entrance Test for those candidates who have "B" certificate.
- Three percent (3%) of the total marks of the Entrance Test (CUET-PG) will be added to the marks obtained in the Entrance Test for those candidates who have "A" certificate.

Note: For the candidate having more than one NCC certificates, the benefit of only the highest category of the certificate shall be permitted.

3.2.3 N.S.S. Volunteers: Two percent (2%) of the total marks of the Entrance Test (CUET-PG) will be added to the marks obtained in the Entrance Test for those NSS volunteers who have attended two 10 days Special Camps and one National Integration Camp subject to the production of relevant NSS certificates.

3.2.4 Person with Disability (PwD):

- (i) Relaxation to the extent of 5% marks in the qualifying examinations shall be given to the PwD candidates as specified under 1.1 and 1.2.
- (ii) Five percent (5%) of the seats in the specified programme is reserved for the Persons with Disability (PwD)/ Differently abled persons on a **horizontal basis**.

3.2.5 Defence Services Quota: Five percent (5%) of the seats are reserved **(horizontal reservation)** for Widows/ Wards/ Wives of the Armed Forces Personnel and Ex-Servicemen (GoI MoD Letter No. 6(1)/2017/D(Res.II) dated May 21, 2018 (Order attached at the end of the brochure). The admission to these reserved seats shall be as per the priorities laid down by MoD which are as under:-

- (a) **Priority I:** Widows/ Wards of Defence personnel killed in action.
- (b) **Priority II:** Wards of disabled in action and boarded out from service.
- (c) **Priority III:** Widows/ Wards of Defence personnel who died in service with death attributable to military service.
- (d) **Priority IV:** Wards of disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service.
- (e) **Priority V:** Wards of Ex-Servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards:
 - i. Param Vir Chakra
 - ii. Ashok Chakra
 - iii. Maha Vir Chakra
 - iv. Vir Chakra
 - v. Shaurya Chakra
 - vi. Sena, Nau Sena, Vayu Sena Medal
 - vii. Mention-in-Despatches.
- (f) **Priority VI:** Wards of Ex-Servicemen.
- (g) **Priority VII:** Wives of:
 - i. defence personnel disabled in action and boarded out from service.
 - ii. defence personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service.
 - iii. ex-Servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards.
- (h) **Priority VIII:** Wards of Serving Personnel.
- (i) **Priority XI:** Wives of Serving Personnel.

Note (1): Admission of Widows/ Wards/ Wives of the Armed Forces Personnel and Ex-Servicemen shall be given as per above priorities (not as per CUET-PG score) and if priorities of more than two applicants are same then admission shall be on the preference to higher CUET score.

Note (2): The above referred letter is issued by the Ministry of Defence (MoD) dated May 21, 2018. Applicants, whose parents/ guardians are working in organizations covered under Ministry of Defence (MoD), shall be allowed to participate in counselling.

Note (3): The documentary evidence for above shall be produced during counselling.

Note (4): The applicants must ensure their eligibility against the 5% horizontal - defence quota, mentioned above in priorities and note (1), (2) & (3) before registration on Samarth Portal.

3.2.6 Kashmiri Migrants : Kashmiri migrants are entitled to concessions as per the UGC and Ministry of Education guidelines.

3.2.7 Counselling (offline) for Admission (based on CUET-PG score):

- (a) There will be counselling in offline mode for each PG programmes in respective teaching departments (or otherwise as notified) of the university.
- (b) It may be in 3-4 rounds, depending upon the vacant seats and need. Every offline round of counselling shall be like **a fresh counselling** with respect to the number of vacant seats advertised/ uploaded on university website. The applicant who could not appear in earlier rounds of offline counselling, due to avoidable reasons, may appear in the next or subsequent rounds.
- (c) The counselling schedule (if offline) shall be declared by the Admission Cell and same will be uploaded on the university website www.dhsgsu.edu.in. The applicant has to appear physically in the counselling and participate in the procedure as per rules and regulations. The final admission shall be given to the applicant by the Departmental Admission Committee constituted by the HoD.
- (d) The CUET-PG score along with weightage of NCC, NSS (or other as allowed) will be the criteria of preparing final merit.

Final merit for admission through CUET = CUET-PG score + Weightage [NCC, NSS (if available)]

- (e) In case, if applicant is unable to present physically, due to unavoidable reasons, he/she can send his/her representatives, along with original documents, to participate in counselling.

3.2.8 Counselling for Admission (Without CUET-PG score):

- (a) As per UGC letter ref. D.O.No. 22-8/2023 (CU)/131275 dated 11th August, 2025 and by the Academic Council of the University via resolution no. AC:19:5(ii) dated 18.07.2024, the admission in **Non-CUET mode** shall be undertaken.
- (b) For this, the Samarth Portal shall be re-open for fresh registrations, after few counselling, for those who could not appeared in the CUET-PG test conducted by the NTA. The CUET score holders can also register themselves, if they could not register earlier due to unavoidable reasons.
- (c) The admission, for these, shall be on the basis of preference and merit of CUET score (if available) otherwise, shall be on the basis of marks obtained in qualifying exam. The applicant holding CUET score shall be preferred (even if of other domain CUET score, if fulfill the eligibility).

3.2.9 Counselling (online) for Admission (based on CUET-PG score):

University may conduct counselling in online mode, if so required and in hybrid mode (few online & few offline). The applicant who could not paid fee against allotted seat (or cancelled admission after allotment) will not be entertain in the next or subsequent online rounds of counselling.

3.2.10 Merging of seats in categories: As per rule and as situation permits.**3.2.11 Spot Counselling:**

The last day of the last counselling, there may be spot counselling (if situation permits) against vacant seats. Those applicants who have yet not registered on the Samarth Portal, till this date, shall be allowed for spot registration (with portal registration fee) and to appear in counselling process with earlier registered on merit basis against vacant seats. The priority of CUET-PG score shall be maintained, if such candidate appears and found eligible on this day.

3.2.12 Foreign Students:

- (i) Direct Admissions to Foreign Students under the DASA Scheme of the Ministry of Education shall be given on a supernumerary basis.
- (ii) Every Foreign Student shall have to undergo a medical test (including a test for AIDS) within a week from the date of admission and shall also produce the certificate of the same, and the student visa within one month of the admission. In case of failure to submit the above-mentioned documents, the admission of the candidate shall stand cancelled.
- (iii) The International Collaboration Cell of the university shall deal with the admission of foreign students.

4.0 One-Year PG programmes:

There will be admission in one-year PG programmes as per NEP-2020 for applicants completing a 4-year Bachelor's programme with Honours/ Honours with Research.

5.0 Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for 'Transfer of Credits':

This SOP provides the procedural framework for accepting transfer of academic credits earned by applicants from other Universities or educational institutions, ensuring that such transfer maintains academic standards and complies with Ordinance-50 of the University governing credit mobility.

Note: Please check the SOP for 'Transfer of Credits' attached at the end of the brochure.

7.0 Refund of Fees:

As per the University Grants Commission (UGC) notification on **Refund of Fees** issued on October 2018 and with the reference of UGC Fee Refund Policy for Academic Session 2025-26, for the session 2026-27, if the student choose to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/she is admitted will be entitled to the refund of fees remitted by him/her as follows:-

A full refund of fees shall be made by the HEIs on account of all cancellations of admissions/migrations of students up to 30 September 2026 and with a deduction of not more than Rs. 1,000, as a processing fee, up to 31 October 2026.

For any admission schedule extending/commencing beyond/after 31 October 2026, the provisions contained in the UGC Notification issued in October 2018 on Refund of Fees shall apply as follows:

S. No.	Percentage of Refund of Aggregate Fees	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is served in the University by the student
(1)	100%	15 days or more before the formally notified last date of admission
(2)	90%	Less than 15 days before the formally notified last date of admission
(3)	80%	15 days or less after the formally notified last date of admission
(4)	50%	30 days or less but more than 15 days, after formally notified last date of admission.
(5)	00%	More than 30 days after formally notified last date of admission

- (1) The submission of online cancellation of application on the **Samarth Admission Portal** is mandatory. Student have to open the registration location with login credential and click the option **Cancel Application** by giving appropriate reason therein.
- (2) Further, as second step for the refund of fees, the recommendation of concerned Head of the Department is mandatory, which is to obtain by filling “**Admission Cancellation and Fees Refund form**” attached at the end of this Admission Brochure.
- (3) Student can submit/send the duly filled hard copy of “**Admission Cancellation and Fees Refund form**” along with required documents like admission fee submission slip/receipt and the copy of bank passbook (applicant’s name should be same as in counselling registration form), by hand (or by post) to Head of the Department. **The date signed by Head of Department on the application form shall be taken into consideration for the deduction in refund amount.**
- (4) Applicant are requested to submit/send the duly filled hard copy of “**Admission Cancellation and Fees Refund form**”, immediately after filing admission cancellation request on Samarth Portal. **The university will not be responsible for such delay if found during the deduction in refund amount.**
- (5) The University reserves the right to cancel/refuse admission at any point of time if it is found that:
 - (a) Minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled.
 - (b) False documentation has been done or facts have been suppressed.
 - (c) Misconduct and indecent communication done by candidate.
 - (d) Irregularities are in admission of candidate.
 - (e) Any other valid reason.

8.0 Teaching and Examination System:

The University follows the CBCS (choice based credit system)/ NEP-2020 with semester system. A two year programme has four semesters with minimum of 80 credits. The evaluation of student is based on internal exam (40%) and end-semester exam (60%). The internal exam is divided into Mid-I (assessment through written test 20%) and Mid-II (through assignments and other methods in 20%).

9.0 Facilities in the University:

- The University campus is spread over an area of about 1300 acres on the top of hills surrounded by green forests, natural and pollution-free environment.
- There is a branch of State Bank of India with an ATM facility.
- The Post office is also available in the campus near girls' hostel.
- The University has a good number of smart classrooms with modern facilities.
- There are sophisticated laboratories for the students of science.
- BSNL tower provides telephone connectivity and internet access in the campus.
- The campus is Wi-Fi enabled.
- The Central Library is equipped with remote access facility.
- The ERP is maintained through Samarth Portal for teachers, employees and students life-cycle.

10.0 Hostel Facility in the University:

There are four hostels for boys and four for girls, all in the university campus. For room allotment in hostel, the concerned wardens may be contacted whose mobile numbers are available on university website www.dhsgsu.edu.in.

11.0 Person with Disability (PwD):

Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) (on horizontal reservation basis) candidates, have to submit a self- attested copy of **Disability Certificate** issued by the District Chief Medical Officer/Medical Board. The disability benefits will be given to only those applicants who have at least 40% disability mentioned in certificate.

11.1 Facilities available for Persons with Disabilities (including Specific Learning Disability - SLD) in the university:

- (i) Ramp at teaching departments/Administrative buildings.
- (ii) Membership of Sugamya Pustakalaya.
- (iii) User friendly university website having text to speech, speech to text, increase and decrease font size, changes in the colour of the website, etc.
- (iv) Learning resource center for Divyangjan (Computer lab, Braille printer, Kibo XS devices, Text to speech software, High speed internet).
- (v) Extra time and helper facility in written examination.

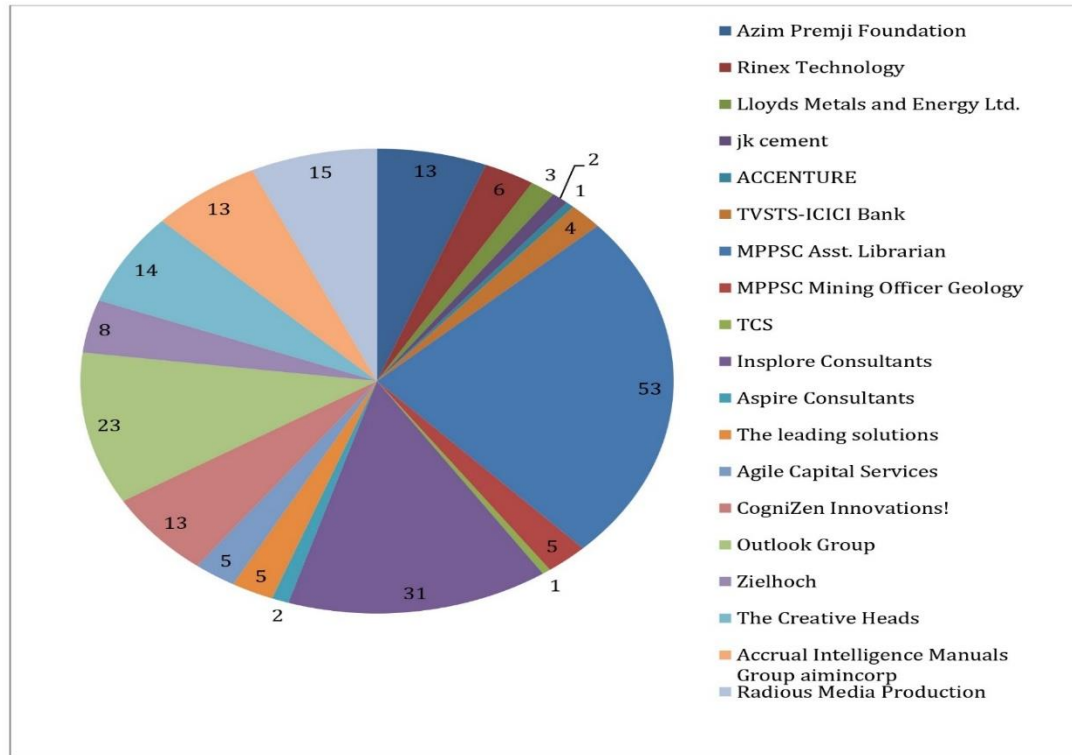

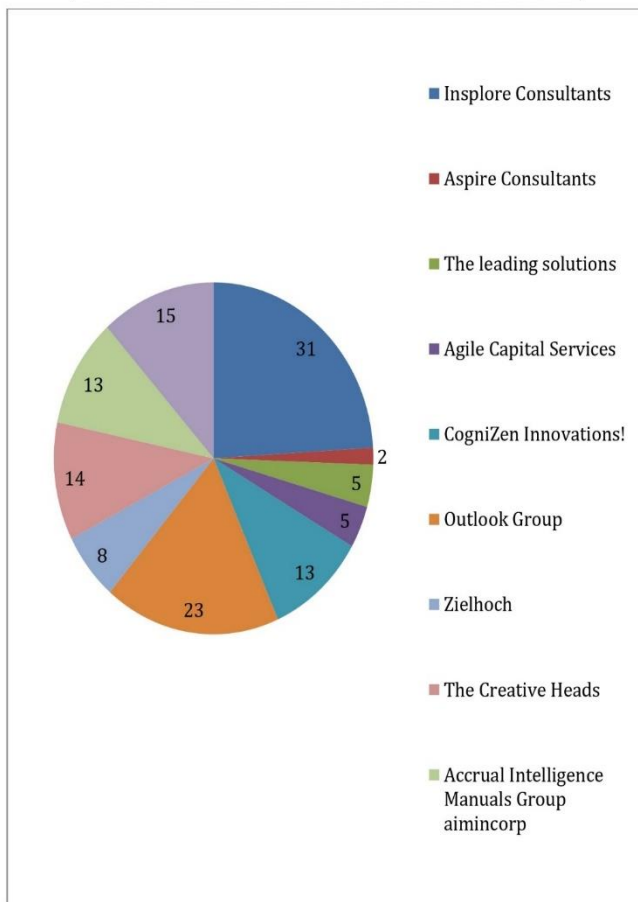

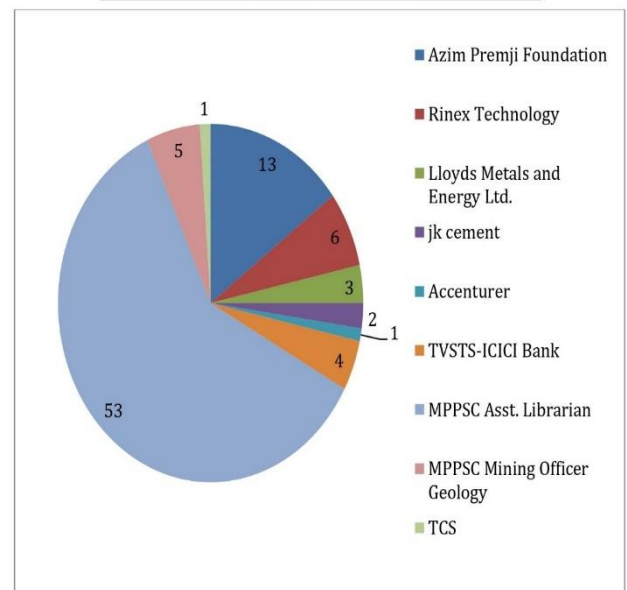

It has come to the notice of UGC that a good number of seats at times remain vacant even after three or four rounds of counselling in some of the Central Universities and their constituent/affiliated colleges. To keep the seats vacant for an entire academic year is not only a waste of resources but also results in denial of quality higher education to many students who aspire to pursue higher studies in Central Universities. University Grants Commission in its 572nd Meeting, held on 20th September 2023 approved a set of Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) to facilitate the Central Universities to fill up their vacant seats. SOPs are enclosed herewith for appropriate action at your end.

It may also be pertinent to mention here that CUET scores will remain the primary criteria for admitting students. In fact, UGC has already written to all the Central Universities to admit students through CUET.

Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for Central Universities to fill up their vacant seats

It has come to the notice of UGC that seats remain vacant in some of the Central Universities even after three or four rounds of counselling. To keep the seats vacant for an entire academic year is not only a waste of resources but also results in denial of quality higher education to many students who aspire to pursue higher studies in Central Universities. Hence, in order to facilitate the Central Universities to fill up their vacant seats, the following SOPs have been formulated with the approval of the Commission:

- CUET scores will remain the primary criteria for admitting students.
- However, students who appeared in CUET, but may or may not have applied to the respective University for the courses/programmes earlier may also be considered.
- Further, students who appeared in CUET may be considered irrespective of the domain subject papers in which they appeared. Here, the University may relax the domain subject-specific criteria for admission to a particular course/programme.
- In case, seats still remain vacant even after exhausting the list of applicants who appeared in CUET, the Universities may take recourse to the following:
 1. The University may consider conducting an entrance examination at its own level or the concerned department of the University may conduct a screening test.
 2. The University may admit students on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination.
- The entire admission process has to be based on merit and transparency.
- Further, the reservation roster shall apply for admission to courses/programmes in all cases.
- The Universities will ensure timely completion of the entire admission process so that no student faces any kind of academic loss.

SOP for 'Transfer of Credits'

Doctor Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar (MP)-470003

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE (SOP) ACCEPTANCE OF TRANSFER OF CREDITS FROM OTHER UNIVERSITIES (Based on Ordinance 50 of the University)

1. OBJECTIVE

This SOP provides the procedural framework for accepting transfer of academic credits earned by students from other Universities or educational institutions, ensuring that such transfer maintains academic standards and complies with Ordinance-50 of the University governing credit mobility.

2. ELIGIBLE INSTITUTIONS

Credits may be accepted from the following institutions:

- Universities recognized under Section 12(b) of the UGC Act.
- Universities that are members of Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- Such foreign University, the Courses/Programmes of which are recognized as equivalent to those of Indian Universities by the AIU.
- IIT, IIM, NIT, IISER, IIIT, SPA, AIIMS,
- Such Indian or Foreign University/educational institution/research institution with which the University has signed an MOU for students and faculty exchange.
- Any other University/educational institution/research institution that has been recognized and approved for the purpose of credit transfer by the Academic Council of the University.

3. ELIGIBILITY OF STUDENTS

Requests for transfer of credits shall be considered only if:

- All the admission will be done on the basis of CUET and UGC Guidelines issued from time to time.
- The request for acceptance of transfer of Credits shall be entertained only if received from such candidates who have been duly selected for admission in a programme of study, as per the Rules and Regulations governing admission in the University.
- The request is submitted within 10 days from the date of admission to the programme.
- The application is made in the prescribed format along with the prescribed processing fee, as prescribed the Academic Council from time to time.
- All required academic documents supporting the credit claim are attached, as prescribed by the Academic Council.

4. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The student must submit the following documents:

- Application for credit transfer
- Official transcript issued by the previous institution
- Detailed syllabus and course content of the courses completed
- Documentary proof of recognition/accreditation of the institution (if required)
- Any additional documents required by the Academic Council or the concerned School.

5. PROCESSING AUTHORITY

The Dean of the concerned School shall act as the Nodal Officer for receiving and processing requests for credit transfer.

To facilitate evaluation, the Dean may constitute a committee consisting of:

- A senior faculty member as Chairperson
- Two to three faculty members from the concerned discipline.

6. EVALUATION OF CREDITS

The committee shall evaluate:

- Course syllabus and learning outcomes
- Number of credits and contact hours
- Level and relevance of the course in relation to the programme of study
- Assessment and grading pattern

Only those courses that are found equivalent in academic content and rigor shall be recommended for credit transfer.

7. APPROVAL PROCESS

- After evaluation the committee shall submit its recommendation to the Dean of the School.
- The Dean shall forward the recommendation to the competent academic authority.
- Final approval shall be granted as per University regulations and decisions of the Academic Council.

8. RECORDING OF CREDITS

Approved credits shall be recorded in the student's academic record.

The transcript of the University shall indicate that the course credits have been 'Transferred' from another recognized institution as per Ordinance-50.

9. QUALITY ASSURANCE

- Only credits from recognized institutions shall be accepted.
- Course equivalence shall be verified by subject experts.
- Periodic review of transfer policies shall be conducted by the Academic Council.

The University reserves the right to reject or partially accept credit transfer requests based on academic evaluation.

10. RECORD MAINTENANCE

The office of the Dean shall maintain records of:

- Applications received
- Evaluation committee reports
- Approved credit transfer cases
- Supporting academic documents

11. FEE STRUCTURE

The Transfer Fee shall be collected from the candidate as decided by the Fee Committee/Finance Committee of the University from time to time.

NOTE:

In the event of any inconsistency in this SOP, the provisions of the parent Ordinances (Ordinance Nos. 50, 39, and 10), along with the UGC guidelines and the decisions of the Academic Council of the University concerning admission/transfer of credits/migration of students issued from time to time, shall prevail.

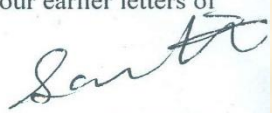
