

SOP for MBA in Germany: Structure Template

Parameter	Rule
Length	500 to 1,000 words, commonly 1 to 2 pages
Leading block	Professional experience, not academics
Formats	Free-form letter, program form, essay set or none
Interview	Expect questions drawn directly from this letter

Block 1: Header and Purpose (60 to 80 words)

Name, exact programme, intake and the professional goal driving the application.

Block 2: Professional Core (200 to 300 words)

Two or three achievements with outcomes attached. Name the team, the budget, the market or the metric. The longest block by design, because German MBA admissions expect real management years.

Block 3: Leadership Evidence (100 to 150 words)

One situation where you carried responsibility for people or money. Include the difficulty and the decision, not only the result.

Block 4: Academic Context (80 to 100 words)

A short paragraph connecting your degree to management work. Do not rebuild an MS-style coursework argument here.

Block 5: Why This Programme (100 to 150 words)

Named specialisations, consulting projects, industry partners or exchange options. Specificity separates serious applications.

Block 6: Why Germany (80 to 100 words)

The industrial and economic reason. Engineering, mobility, logistics, energy or European market access. Never affordability.

Block 7: Goals and Close (80 to 100 words)

A specific post-MBA role and a confident finish.

Before You Submit

Check whether the programme wants a free-form letter or set questions. Confirm every number you state, because German MBA interviews commonly quote the letter back to the applicant. Write the visa statement separately.
